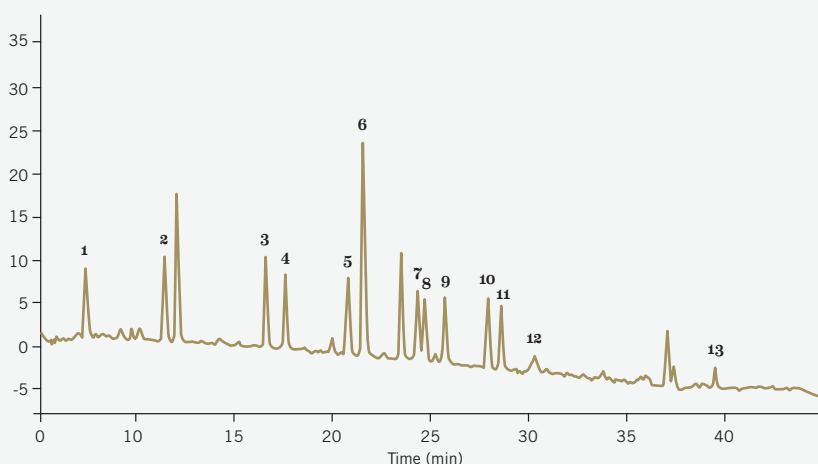


FIGURE 17: Antihistamines and Expectorants

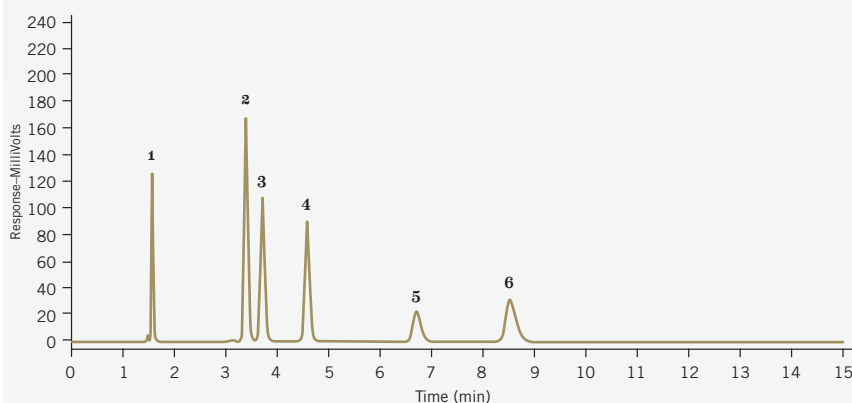


FIGURE 18: Ibuprofen and Related Impurities

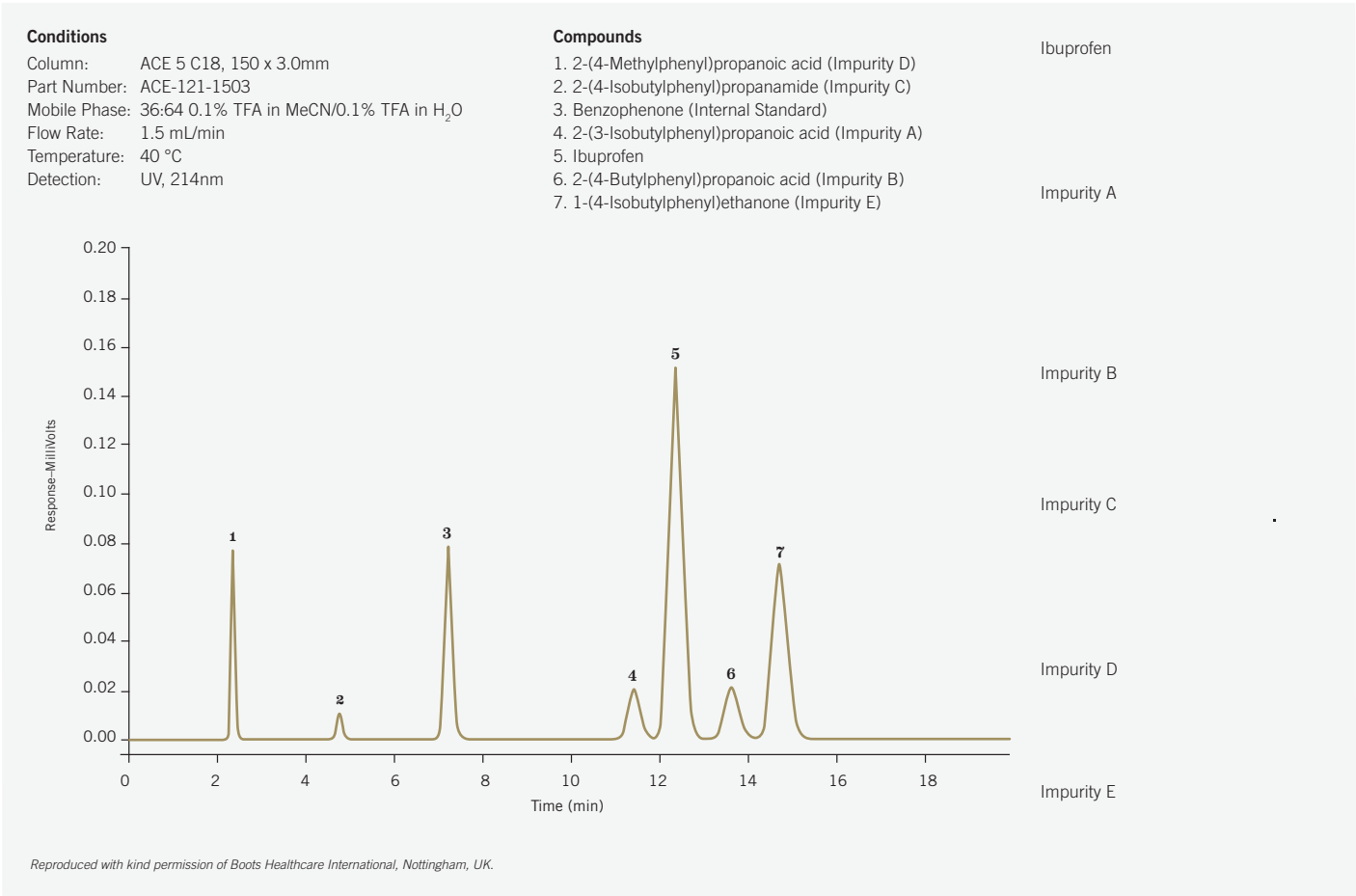


FIGURE 19: Tryptic Digest of BSA
